Participants in the army's cyber course are strictly selected, and out of around 250 prospective students, only just under 20 make it into the course. The course lasts 40 weeks. During this time, participants are trained in IT basics, incident response, forensics, leadership and other cyber topics. As part of the training, participants also have the opportunity to complete an internship at a critical infrastructure. The Swiss Armed Forces' cyber training is in great demand both at home and abroad. There are many companies that are very interested in the graduates. Foreign armed forces regularly send participants to the cyber training course of the Swiss Armed Forces. The quality of our military cyber specialists is regularly demonstrated at international events. Our Joint Blue Team recently finished 7th out of 24 teams at the NATO exercise «LOCKED SHIELDS».

Mr Ben-Ari holds a double B.A. in Geography & Environmental Studies from Haifa University in Israel






